What is Laser therapy?

LLLT or low level laser therapy is a non invasive and pain free procedure that uses light to stimulate cell regeneration and increase blood circulation.

Low-level laser therapy is still a relatively new concept that is being used more recently to treat dogs, cats or small animals with arthritis, tendon or soft tissue injuries such as scaring and to promote wound healing.

Laser therapy can treat acute and chronic injuries, sprains and strains, arthritis, swelling due to back disc problems, and muscular-skeletal abnormalities. It also helps to regenerate nerve tissue after surgery and promote the healing process.

How Does it Work?

Lasers are nothing more than a beam of light that travels at a certain frequency that allows the laser to penetrate the tissue and stimulate the cells. Some cold lasers like ours are programmable to a range of frequencies in order to treat many different types of problems in dogs and small animals.

Dogs and other animals find laser therapy relaxing and tend to enjoy the treatment. There is no need to shave or clip the area to be treated and the dog or small animal doesn't need to be sedated during the process which means it is completely non-invasive for the animal.



Whats Involved?

Laser therapy won't cause your dog or small animal any unwanted side effects. The laser used for this type of treatment will not burn your pet's skin.

Laser therapy improves the quality of a pet's life as well as the life of its owner, because if your pet is happy, you are happy.

It is an excellent tool for post-surgical healing. Usable over pins and plates with research showing its positive effects on the re-growth of both bone and nerve as well as soft tissue.

Animals often visibly relax during treatment - a result of the therapy's demonstrated ability to increase endorphin release. This is particularly effective for tackling anxiety related behaviours such as lick granuloma and feather plucking.
